LAYING FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE

The emotional well-being of our children at Herries is very important to our school ethos. We lay foundations for literacy and numeracy through play based activities focusing on a different topic each term. The children have music and French lessons with our teaching specialists from further up the school. We have a wonderful outdoor learning area and the children use this daily and our local wild woods for their forest school activities.

FAMILY ACTION

07 Junior Years 1-2

In pre prep, schemes of work follow the National Curriculum though our aim is to teach beyond the levels set for each age group.

In Literacy, words underpin everything we do and pupils are taught to express themselves confidently both orally and in writing. Lively texts and stories, backed up with imaginative teaching methods, give the children the confidence to be creative while at the same time broadening and developing their comprehension skills. One of the most striking impressions that Herries makes on visitors is that the children are happy, open, friendly and confident in conversation.

In Numeracy sessions, Years 1 and 2 build on the early mathematical concepts learnt at the Foundation Stage. Children learn and develop at different speeds so we plan the activities accordingly and give plenty of encouragement and praise. We see the understanding and enjoyment of mathematics as being central to the success of our pupils.

In Science, the emphasis on practical and investigative activities continues, as children are encouraged to develop their thinking skills, working individually and in groups. They build on their knowledge and understanding of scientific concepts learning to collect and evaluate evidence.

History, Geography and Religious Studies are taught through topic work so that the Humanities are given a context in which children can better understand the world in which we live.

Senior Years 3-6

From Years 3 to 6, children continue to have a form teacher but are taught by specialist subject teachers.

Herries pupils work in an atmosphere that encourages achievement in the classroom and beyond. Our aim is to develop the ability to work independently and to this end we set regular homework tasks, appropriate to the age of the child and their abilities and interests.

The core subjects of English and Mathematics are taught on a daily basis and Science twice weekly. In small classes, the children have weekly sessions of French, Geography, History and Religious Education, PSHE, Music, Art, Design Technology and ICT, PE and Sport.

Competition and Co-operation

We believe that a healthy body encourages a healthy mind and so sport and exercise form a crucial part of the children's day to day life at Herries.

We encourage all children to regularly compete in teams promoting development of all abilities, not just the most able. Learning to be competitive, to encourage each other and to work as part of a team are equally as important as the obvious benefits to physical health.

There is an extensive Games programme scheduled within school hours and beyond. We have a partnership with the National Sports Centre at Bisham and use their facilities weekly for Hockey and Football. Tag Rugby, Netball and Gymnastics take place within the Herries grounds, whilst we travel locally for Swimming, Tennis and Athletics.



Music and Drama

MUSIC

Music is a very important part of the curriculum at Herries; each class, including Nursery, has a weekly music lesson with a music specialist. The music room is equipped with a wide range of instruments and equipment including keyboards and percussion instruments. The curriculum is designed for continuity and progression.

We believe that every child should be encouraged to enjoy and appreciate all aspects of music through performing, composing and listening. It should be a creative and enjoyable activity and we provide opportunities for all children to compose, perform and appraise music, to develop the skills to appreciate a wide variety of music. Practical activities, with an enquiry based approach, allow pupils to make decisions for themselves and direct their learning and the outcomes of their composition and performance work.

DRAMA

The dramatic arts are central to life at Herries and we are firm believers in the importance of Drama on the school curriculum and beyond.

Our drama classes provide pupils with an outlet for emotions, thoughts and creativity that they might not otherwise have ways to express. Through taking on another role pupils can experiment with personal choices and solutions through problems faced by characters in literature or historical figures.

Drama classes are on the curriculum from Nursery through to Year 6. All children take part in school performances from Nativities to musicals. There is also a popular after school Drama club which leads to The London Academy of Music and Dramatic Arts (LAMDA) exams. The success of these, with the majority of our pupils achieving merit and distinction grades, is indicative of our excellence in this area. We also enter inter school poetry competitions.

We enjoy regular visits from theatre companies and Perform4schools who organise lively workshops for pre-prep children in particular.

After School Clubs

After the school academic day finishes there is an opportunity for pupils from Reception to Year 6 to join an after school activity.

It's a great chance for our pupils to take part in something new, or something that complements the academic and sporting curriculum in a safe, familiar environment.

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
